From the Desk of the District Warden – March 2013

My brothers,

Karen and I try to attend Mass in Lake Tahoe on the first Sunday of the month to help support the Knights of Saint Theresa's in their monthly fundraiser. After a great breakfast and Mass we had the entire afternoon left with nothing to do. We decided that rather than go home we would venture over to Carson City. We did a little shopping and found it was still too early so we decided to visit the old town of Virginia City.

If it has been awhile since you have been to Virginia City I would high suggest that you again visit Saint Mary's in the Mountains Catholic Church. In 2009 a massive restoration and retrofit project was undertaken. They have completely restored this beautiful 1875 church which was originally established by Father Patrick Manogue.

Fr. Patrick Manogue was a student, gold miner, seminarian, and priest of the Comstock. He built the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento and became the first Bishop of the Sacramento Diocese; in 1886 he was appointed by Pope Leo XIII. In those days the diocese encompassed many counties in Northern California and Nevada.

Many Catholic institutions still bear his name in California and Nevada.

The Cathedral style structure is a work of beauty inside and out and is an active parish with around 50 families holding Saturday and Sunday services.

But there is an additional feature you must plan on seeing. In the large basement of the church they have established a free museum with every kind of Catholic artifact and volumes of written history and pictures assembled from every parish from the old Grass Valley Diocese, and Catholic churches from the current Reno and Sacramento Dioceses.

Our docent Jacquie took us from room to room with some of the most interesting history of the Catholic Church--items so rare and precious to our faith in the Old West. They are very proud of what they have assembled, and to be honest I was very impressed. We arrived at 1:30 PM. I so enjoyed our visit that when I again looked at my watch it was 4:30PM. Please take the time to visit and spend a long afternoon. You will not be disappointed.
